

BENJAMIN W. YOUNG, JR
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Mr. Young is the founder of USPES and functions both as an INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR associated with the TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC. 2016 BUSINESS MODEL and as a recruiter of INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS for TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC. BUSINESS MART CALL CENTERS.

Mr. Young served in the U.S. MARINE CORPS RESERVES, as a PLATOON LEADER CANDIDATE, for over four years, while in college. He was injured during training exercises and received an honorable discharge in 1965.

Mr. Young was accepted into a U.S. Air Force Officer program that same year, to serve as an Electronics Communications Officer.

Mr. Young began his professional career, prior to graduating with a BS in Electrical Engineering, by working with a land use study group and designed a computer program for interpretation of data in highway planning.

Upon graduating in 1966 as an Electrical Engineer, Mr. Young moved to Los Angeles, where he worked in power distribution, power system operations and control, and coordinated the use of data processing systems for purchasing with a major computer system primarily used for engineering functions.

Because of critical skills, shortly after graduating, Mr. Young was given a draft deferment and, at the request of group he was working with, chose to continue his professional work instead of going into the U.S. Air Force.

In addition to his professional work, Mr. Young continued his educational pursuits with graduate courses in computer design, and in power engineering. He also taught computer programming at the junior college level.

In 1969 Mr. Young was invited to be one of a group of founding members of a worldwide computer time-sharing offering.

Mr. Young served in several technical and managerial capacities around the world, offering computer time-sharing services, working with many major corporations, government entities, and small businesses in the development and use of systems through a computer time-sharing network. He focused on business applications design, development, and implementation; on computer-aided circuit design; and, on the design and implementation of small and major applications using relational data base technology. He consulted with a government owned telecommunications firm in Europe, helping design and implement an on-line purchasing system. He later formed a corporation that used the computer time-sharing services to provide worldwide purchasing control design, development, and operation, to a major government owned oil firm in Latin America; after the system was complete and operational, he sold his interest in that company, but the system he put in place continued to be used within the computer time-sharing network environment for over five years.

Early on in this period, Mr. Young continued educational pursuits, focusing on business financial planning and analysis.

Throughout this period, Mr. Young had the opportunity of being exposed and involved in a plethora of different business problems in a wide range of industries and disciplines, with solutions provided through computer time-sharing application development and use.

In 1980, Mr. Young began working as a data processing recruiter.

In 1983 Mr. Young became deeply interested and involved in solar energy and, in 1984, became a manufacturer's representative for solar energy equipment and other energy saving devices.

In 1986, when the solar energy industry faltered due to tax credits not being renewed, Mr. Young returned to data processing recruiting.

In 1988 Mr. Young focused on developing business internationally for a private bank.

In 1990 Mr. Young obtained an insurance license and focused on selling health insurance to small businesses.

In 1992 Mr. Young began recruiting sales personnel for an energy company that raised funds for projects and in late 1993 began recruiting sales personnel for educational computers.

In 1994, as an off-shoot of working with educational computers, Mr. Young developed a business plan to place computers in businesses around the world to sell products and services for firms that provided the computers. That plan led to the development and deployment of a business plan based on the use of a "Low-cost High-value Product" ("LHP"), which was an accounting software-package, to fund business ventures in general.

In 1996 LHP led to the development of a business venture known as the INTERNET CATALOGUE CLUB and of digital exchange mediums known as ZCASH and CHIPS.

In 1999, Mr. Young transferred his focus to international financing to support projects of members of the INTERNET CATALOGUE CLUB. It was during this period that Mr. Young determined that even the legitimate offerings for such financing were highly unreliable and, by applying reverse engineering, he began developing his own methods for such funding.

By 2006 ZCASH and CHIPS had been used in the execution of small and large business transactions around the world and the U.S. SEC decided to intervene, which intervention would provide an ultimate and lengthy test to the concepts developed and used by Mr. Young.

A civil lawsuit was launched by the U.S. SEC, with Mr. Young as one of the principal targets.

However, in 2012 that lawsuit was terminated by a CONSENT DECREE and a FINAL JUDGEMENT in USA FEDERAL COURT, wherein it was declared that neither party prevailed.

That six-year litigation provided Mr. Young a wealth of experience and knowledge that few have had the opportunity to accrue, as the financing methods developed withstood that intense legal onslaught.

During that time, and afterwards, Mr. Young continued to work as a consultant to the INTERNET CATALOGUE CLUB, helping both businesses and governments worldwide integrate into that framework, serving in various related capacities, until August of 2016.

Using the knowledge accumulated during a lifetime of experiences and resources (including hydrogen clean energy technology, to use sand to produce clean energy and drinking water) accrued by TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC (a Nevada USA firm founded in 2004 with Mr. Young as an Officer) through use of protocols related to those experiences, in August of 2016 Mr. Young laid the foundation for the TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC 2016 BUSINESS MODEL; and, now, Mr. Young focuses on supporting the use of that model through USPES, through several Texas firms, for which Mr. Young is a beneficial owner and functions as Secretary/Treasurer; and, Mr. Young serves in the capacity of INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR and as a recruiter of INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, dedicated to expanding world use of the TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC 2016 BUSINESS MODEL.

Through USPES, Mr. Young works with a select client base of entrepreneurs, firms, and government entities that choose to do business using the TEXAS HOLDINGS, INC 2016 BUSINESS MODEL.

Most recently, as of February 27, 2023, Mr. Young has also been appointed as Secretary/Treasurer of ESQS Partners, LLC; which is a trust wherein the Trustee is a US Court Officer, a Texas Attorney that represents Howse Services, Inc (“HOWSE”); with HOWSE being a Texas firm for which Mr. Young is also the Secretary/Treasurer.
