Its domestic marketplace was to the avid sportsman, rescue, forest service and outdoor adventurer. Compliance with licensing requirements was required from each of the fifty states and the National Transportation Safety Board. AVI also had a very active involvement in international sales. Demise of the organization in the domestic market occurred as Ford, GM and Chrysler introduced new products in the SUV marketplace for the first time which included independent four wheel drive suspension and a price tag which dropped from around \$24,000 per vehicle to \$14,000 per vehicle. International customers were primarily Arab nations which wanted the vehicles for military use. The U.S. government took an increasingly active role and ultimately suggested no more vehicle sales be made to some of these nations after threats of terrorism were communicated to some of the company officers.

MicroAge (1993-1997)

MicroAge peaked at 6.3 billion dollars in revenue in 1996. My responsibilities were to assist and recruit fortune 500 companies for integration with their present business models a customer friendly internet presence. This included web design, secure commerce, help desk, shopping cart, credit management, back office and inventory management issues. Video conferencing, training, and sales presentations were designed, provisioned and installed for customers where requirements dictated contact with remote offices and customers. Internet access for use of monitoring, interrogating and controlling energy management devices was pioneered with an Oklahoma Gas and Electric subsidiary, Geothermal Design and Engineering. Computer telephony solutions with internet integration for low cost or no cost long distance services were also deigned, provisioned and installed for large corporate customers.

Computer Analyst and Business Owner (1971 – 1993)

In 1972, I authored software for use on an IBM computer with online terminals. This became the second commercial computer site in the nation for IBM and was a showcase for a new movement in the computer industry. I began my computer career and business ownership in 1973 with an investment of \$700. In 1973 I became a commercial oem for Digital Equipment Company. By 1980 my firm was the seventh largest commercial oem for DEC in the world with over fifty analysts and five million dollars in revenue. Our clients were located on three continents. Systems integration with Control Data Corporation was added to our line of products in 1982 as more mass storage systems became available and required for large scale computer centers. I have personally designed and authored over a million lines of computer software. My specific area of expertise for approximately twenty years is grain accounting in agricultural cooperatives. Inventory management, financial reporting, accounts receivable, payroll, payables, depreciation, credit management, sales management, bar coding, cash registers, automated fuel systems, automated scales for truck weights and grain bin temperature sensors were all part of the software products I designed, marketed, supported and enhanced. A service network of computer repair personnel was also available to all our clients as my specific market niche involved turnkey solutions for the customer.
